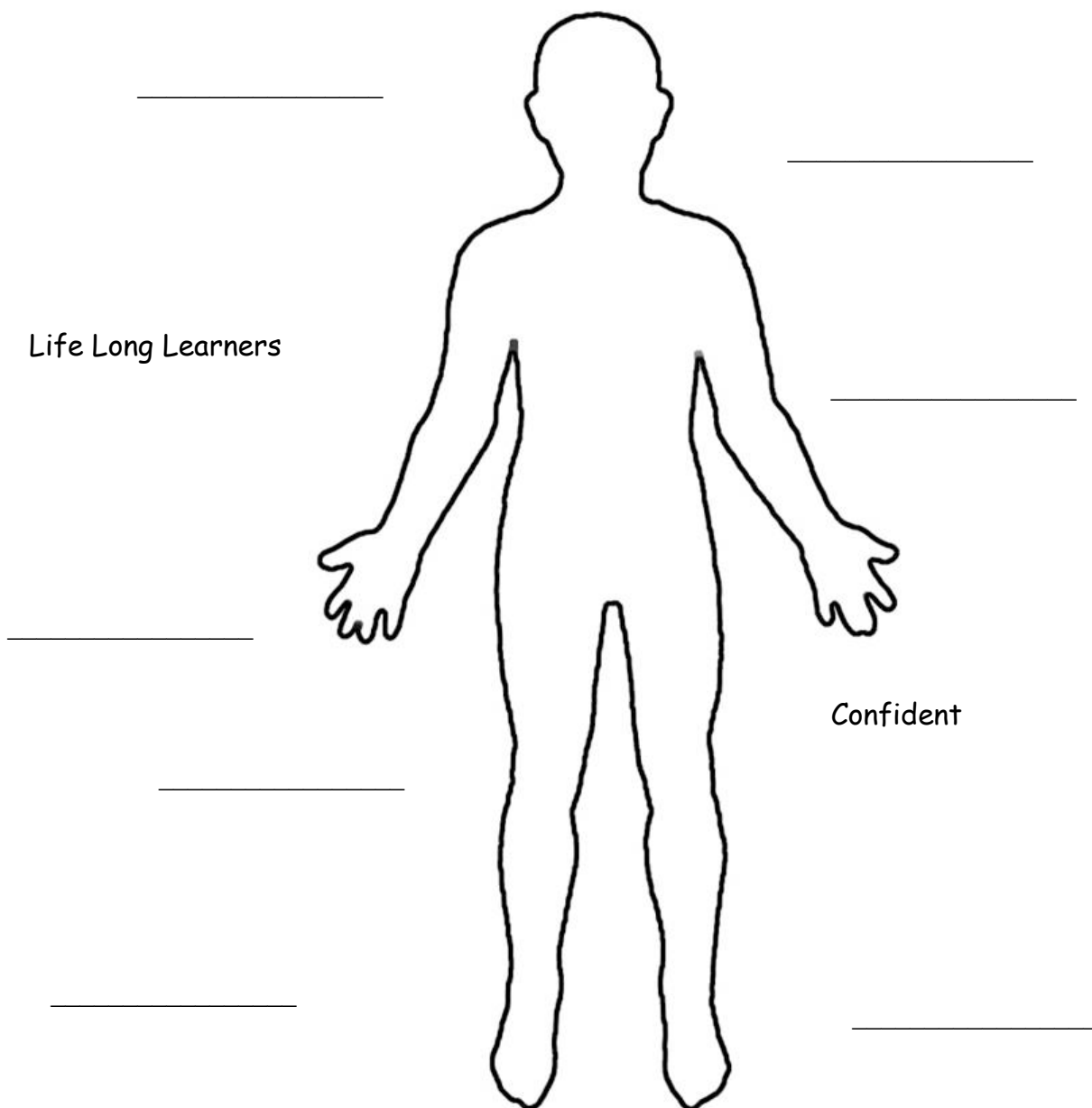


A Shared Vision
